

English

This term, we are learning to write a suspense narrative, a portal narrative, a diary entry and an information report. We will base our writing on the stories Staying Out and The Door. Also, we will learn to write a range of list poems.

Maths

We will study shape, money, area, length, perimeter, time, statistics and decimals.

Additionally, children will continue to practise their rapid recall of multiplication facts up to the twelve timetables.

Science

We will be investigating plants and classification of living things. The children will focus on the structure of plants and how water is transported within them. They will explore ways of classifying animals and understand how we can protect animal's habitats.

Music

The class will explore changes in pitch, tempo and dynamics. They will listen to the work of Smetana, Vivaldi, Beethoven and Holst. Next, pupils will learn about the Samba and carnival music. They will have the opportunity to compose their own music inspired by these genres.

Physical Education

This term we will be focusing on cricket and outdoor and adventurous activities. Pupils will learn how to work as a team and improve their fielding and batting techniques.

Computing

Pupils will collect data as well as access data captured over long periods of time. They will look at data points, data sets, and logging intervals. Pupils will spend time using a computer to review and analyse data. We will also focus on privacy, security and copyright.

History

Pupils will investigate the changes in children's lives through time. They will learn how children's spare time, health and work have changed. They explore the most crucial change – work – in more detail, learning about a day in the life of a working child and the significance of Lord Shaftesbury and his impact.

Geography

Fantastic Firs will investigate the question: Are all settlements the same? They will identify human and physical features within Bitterley, as well as how the land is used. They will use this knowledge to compare Bitterley with New Delhi.

Pupils will take part in fieldwork activities.
