## New Behaviour System, Green, Yellow and Red Cards.

The school parliament met with Mr Halstead to discuss making the behaviour system better. We have decided we are going to use a red, yellow and red card system.

Green Card = Indication that the child has done something good.

Yellow Card = This is a warning to modify behaviour.

Red Card = The pupil misses break and the teacher/TA who has issued the card will call parents to tell them.

If 3 red cards are given, there will be a meeting with the pupil's parent.

Guidance:

Green Card	Exceeding expectations in either work or behaviour. Examples of such behaviour include: a child has produced an exceptional piece of work when measured against their own ability; a child has gone out of their way to help; a pupil has overcome a problem or issue that they did not find easy.
Yellow Card	A warning for low level disruption. It means that behaviour/work/attitude needs to improve. Examples of such behaviour include: pushing in a line; giggling/chatting in a lesson; ignoring instructions.
Red Card	Usually given if a yellow card(s) has not resulted in a change to a child's behaviour or quality of work. It might also be given if there are any extreme behaviours that parents should be informed of. E.g. A pupil has received two yellow cards within a short period of time – a morning session. Such behaviours might be; deliberate, malicious violent acts; swearing and/provoking others; open, deliberate defiance – e.g walking out of a classroom in anger.
