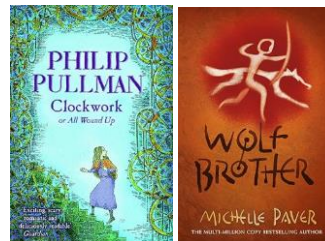

Curriculum

As Writers we will: learn the story of the Alien Abduction using our Talk 4 Writing story map. We will then box up and innovate the story to make it our own, before writing our very own version! We will then look at how to write a set of instructions on how to make a sundial and have a go at writing our own. After half term we will learn the suspense story The Gas Mask and create explanation reports inspired by The Gas Mask.

As Readers we will: discuss a variety of fiction, non-fiction and poetry texts. Each extract will be accompanied by comprehension questions which focus on retrieval, vocabulary and inference.

As Mathematicians we will: develop our understanding of place value, addition, subtraction, multiplication and division written methods. After half term we will learn to order and compare fractions, calculate equivalent fractions, multiply and divide fractions and identify the value of decimal numbers.

As Scientists we will: We are learning about earth and space. We will name the planets in the solar system and explore the reasons for night and day. We will explain how the Moon moves relative to the Earth and explore moon phases. Later in the term we will be exploring how a variety of different forces such as gravity, friction, water resistance and air resistance can be used to retrieve a meteorite.

As Historians we will: consider the impact of World War 2 on British people. We will identify the causes of World War 2 and identify the distinct phases in the Battle of Britain. Throughout the topic we will make inferences and deductions about a photograph and describe how children may have felt when evacuated.

As Geographers we will: learn what life is like in Alps and identify key aspects of the human and physical geography of the Alps.

As Design Technologists we will: design, make and evaluate our stuffed toys considering the main component shapes of the toy.

As Artists we will: This pathway enables us to consider how 2-dimensional drawing might relate and transform to 3-dimensional making. We will explore negative space and grid drawing.

As Musicians we will: We will be learning to perform songs from World War 2. We will follow scores and melody lines and recall a counter melody.

In RE we will: We will learn Outline the importance of Creation on the timeline of the 'big story' of the Bible. We will identify what type of text some Christians say Genesis 1 is, and its purpose and consider human impact on the earth.
